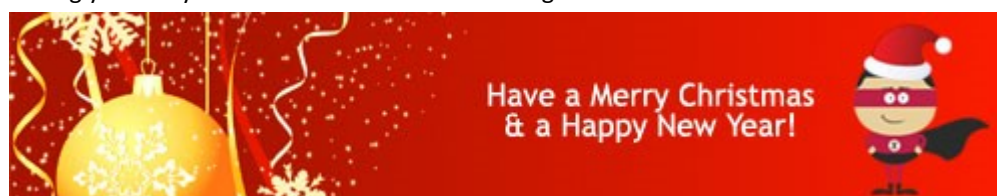
CHRISTINE'S CHATTERBOX

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

November 2017

- Rotary Club of Clayton's project – Moradabad Mobile Health Camps – India (\$1,000). Payment has been made to the Rotary Foundation (in accordance with global grant application procedure)
- Nasavusavu Special Education School. RC FTG currently sponsors 10 students but this will increase to 15 commencing with the next school year. In following up last year's sponsors:
- Julie Goodchild has agreed to continue sponsoring Daiana Daga-ga (Julie & Mark have sponsored Daiana since commencement of this project).
- Greg Downes – Grake Kamell didn't complete the year so Greg has declined further sponsorship at this time.
- Ken Sharpe – is no longer a Rotarian and has declined further sponsorship of Sisilia Okustino. I propose Sisilia be taken up as one of our club's additional five for next year.
- Lyndal & Colin McVie have decided to discontinue their sponsorship of Azlin Singh and Semiti Kaulotu. So, again, I am suggesting these two students be taken up as part of the club's additional five students for 2018.
- From correspondence received from the newly formed RC Savu Savu board it would appear that not all of the funds sent for the students of the Special Ed. School have been used in past years and that they are currently hold approximately \$7,000. I am in discussions with both them and the ABC Board to decide what project these funds could be used for. It is important to note that there **has been no misappropriation of funds**. This may take some time but I will keep the Board/Club members informed of any further developments.
- I have not heard from RC Templestowe as to who the new ABCD Board members are.

Upcoming Projects:

- **Malawi (Days for Girls) project.** I spoke to PDG Carol Lawton at a recent Presidents' meeting. She promised to follow up with Frank and get back to us. Unfortunately we have still not yet heard back from Carol or Frank re our possible involvement.
- **Fairhills – Thailand Project.** A cheque for \$1,000 was handed over to Adrienne Tanner for this project. She and the students are currently in Thailand so we look forward to hearing about their adventures when they return.
- **Hatu Balico, Ainaro Province, Timor L'Este** – This project to repair, replace and extend water systems because of the high incidence of diarrhoea resulting in infant mortality and childhood stunting will affect 1200 people, including 460 children and will be complemented by further work being done by Plan International to improve the sanitation aspects of three communities so they can achieve "hygienic" status. This is of "highest priority" for Ainaro Province. Our club has committed \$2,000 to this project which is hopefully going to start in January 2018.

As the Christmas festive season is upon us, spend time with family and friends. It is a great time to relax, recharge and reflect with pride to what we have achieved and will continue to contribute in the second half of this Rotary year. Just to jog the memory, I mention the following: Polio Eradication: We are making headway in eliminating this terrible disease. In 2013 there were 416 cases, so far, this Rotary year there has been 17 cases reported. We are on the way to zero and 2018 well may be the year we reach it. It is important to understand that this won't mean our work is over. Rotary is committed to polio eradication until the world is certified polio free. For that to happen, we must be sure beyond any doubt that there is not a single virus left anywhere in the world. Poliovirus is very good at hiding and that is why we put so much effort into surveillance: looking not only for new cases of the disease, but for signs of the virus in waterways and sewage. Once at least three years have passed from the last time poliovirus is found, an independent committee will certify the world polio-free. Then, and only then, will our work be done. Until then, it's vital that we keep on doing everything we're doing now: all the surveillance, all the immunizations, and all the advocacy work. Congratulations to the 20 Clubs that took up the challenge to support the eradication of polio by contributing US\$1,000 to the Rotary Foundation and see their contribution

grow to US\$7,500 with the matching grants from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, RI and District 9810; totalling US\$150,000. Don't forget, if your Club missed out on this initiative, you can still benefit from the 2 for 1 offer from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation for the balance of the Rotary year. ROMAC: In September the District 9810 ROMAC team swung into action again to help save a 9-year-old boy, Patricio, from Timor Leste, to have life-saving surgery at the Royal Children's Hospital. The surgery was needed to remove a tumour from the right side of the chest that had been identified as malignant and requiring 4 courses of chemotherapy. In late November Patricio got the "all clear" to return home to Dili and continue ongoing chemotherapy but be with his family who were over the moon to have a happy and healthy boy with them. It is the goal of the ROMAC committee to "save the lives of 2 ROMAC patients" and through Clubs and individual donors raise \$50,000 this year. I urge you to get involved in the challenge and perhaps run an event similar to RC Bentleigh Moorabbin Central with their Trash N Treasure market; that is to run a stall to support ROMAC. Membership: It is great to see many Clubs are exploring the opportunities of Organisational Membership and establishing Satellite Clubs. Also, don't forget the new initiatives District is proposing. Partner Membership: encouraging spouses of Rotarians to become members of their partner's Rotary Club. Get your Club to be part of the pilot program. Contact PDG Jenny Coburn.
