1. Nourishment: Yang follows mainly a Mediterranean diet based mostly on lots of natural vegetables and goat meat and cheese.

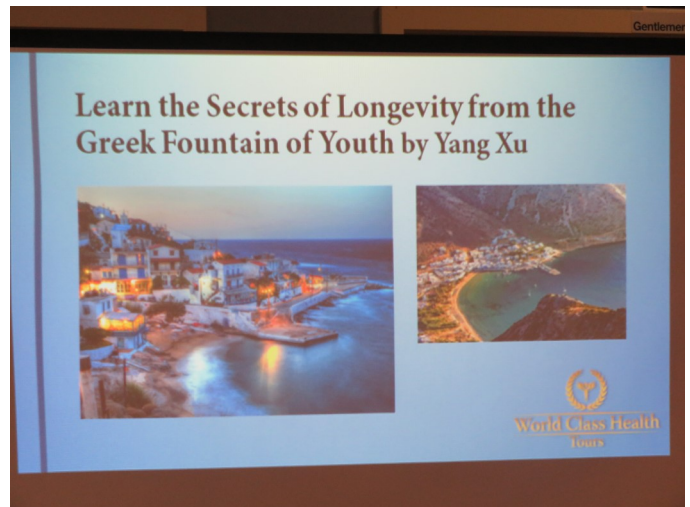
2. Movement: Lots of exercise and outdoor activities.

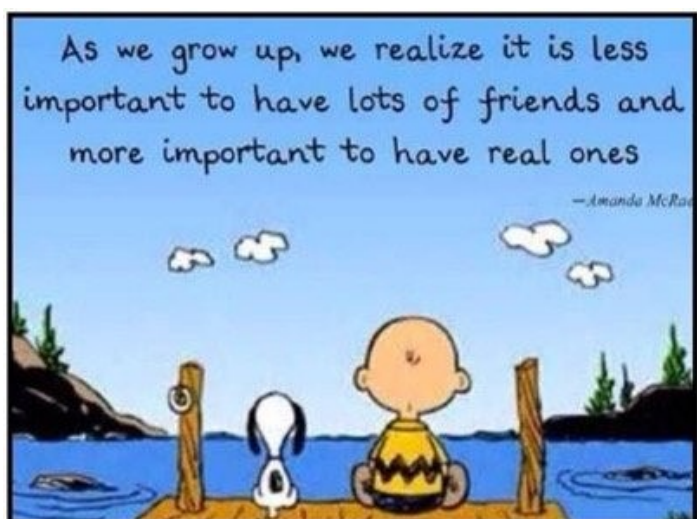
