Wednesday, 4th April 2018

The meeting opened at 7.00pm

President Christine

- Christine also sought members cooperation to plant fifteen trees.

Reports

Secretary Paul Mc A. indicated that the mail had been distributed.

Treasurer Enid

- said that the admin account was temporarily "in the red" as the budget had provided for income from the now cancelled Martin and Emma's lunch but that she hoped the account would be balanced by 31 May.
- She also reminded chairmen that their reports and budgets for the annual report were required by the end of the month.

- He also mentioned that the Junior Community Award diaries were not yet available.
- Paul also reported that the National Youth Science Award applicant had not responded to his email. He will check if she wishes to proceed.
- MUNA is scheduled for 5&6 May and Paul will confirm details and advise the club.
- In relation to RYLA Paul said that to date we had no candidate but he would check with Fairhills and FTG North to see if there was interest.

Sergeant— Ray managed to both increase our knowledge and rip our dollars off us.

Speaker—Peter Malden spoke about the Tavenui project in Fiji which the Boronia club and Peter and his wife Jan have operated now for some years and which our club has contributed to.

He related the various building projects that have been undertaken including restoration of cyclone damage but he spoke in detail of the eye project which has restored sight to hundreds. The group of professionals have full use of the local hospital

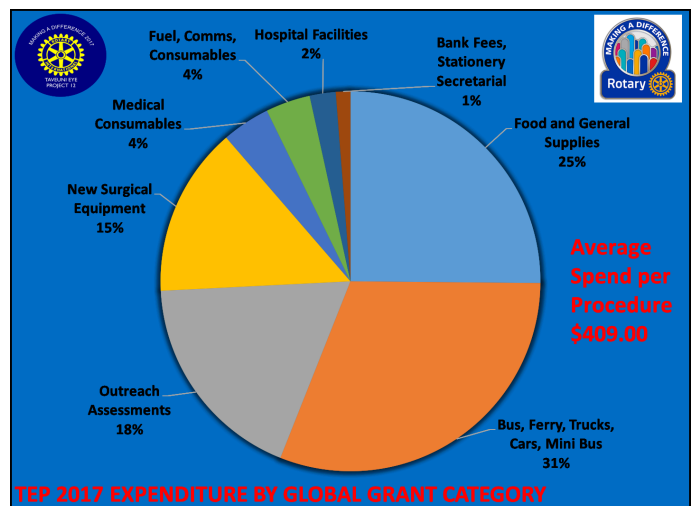
fourteen days and last year carried out four hundred procedures in the ten days.

The extent of the project is amazing when it is realised that during the ten day period the group also served seven thousand meals and conducted an extensive transport service bringing patients to and from the hospital.

Peter showed a short video which reinforced the worth of the project and showed a number of pieces of costly equipment that required replacement or adding to. He said that he hoped that our club would again support the project.

President Christine thanked Peter, as had chairman Paul and she noted that next week was a partners night.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE MONTHLY REPORT

March 2018

Nasavusavu Special Education School.

- It is now official – as of 31st March The Rotary Club of Templestowe will no longer sponsor ABC Dreams Australia Inc. Our decision to discontinue our sponsorship of the Nasavusavu Special Ed. Students through ABCD was indeed the right one. I have been in contact with a couple of the other clubs and encouraged them to follow our lead in dealing direct with Fiji.
- The furniture which we agreed should be purchased is now installed and the children much better equipped.
- RC Savusavu are pursuing the possibility of purchasing laptops/notebooks for the students to use in class. The Principal and teachers are very enthusiastic about this. I have asked for further details and a quote.

Hatu Balico, Ainaro Province, Timor L'Este

- The Rotary Foundation have approved this Global Grant and the project will go ahead. Our sponsorship of \$2,000 has been submitted.

Interplast –

- I have arranged for Liz Guiver (District Chair, Interplast) to come and present to our club. As agreed at the last Board Meeting, we will hand over a cheque to Liz for \$2,000 as our contribution to this truly worthwhile project.

Upcoming Projects:

- At this District Conference I was in conversation with Robyn Stokes (RC Box Hill Central) who is passionate about *Rotarians Against Slavery* I arranged for her and her husband Tony to come and speak to our members about sponsorship of RC Manningham's project Sungai Kolok – Anti Trafficking and Medical Outreach program in Southern Thailand. Robyn has been to our club before (2015) and is looking forward to speaking to us again. I will be proposing to the Board that we contribute \$1,500 to this project.

Outstanding Budget Sponsorships –

- We still have \$1,000 each budgeted for RAM, Operation Cleft and a possible Croatian project. As there are still more funds available in the Benevolent account I will be pursuing more projects for the club to consider.
