
- Peppertree Hill Retirement Village suggested date 3rd May but TBC

Each member was given a MYTHS and FACT Sheet. With 20 questions and many were amazed that our knowledge on Suicide, needs to be re addressed.


A wonderful presentation Rod—well done! This subject needs to be looked at and what we can do to assist our local community.

Rotary's early emblem was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust). It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who was an engraver. He designed the emblem to represent both civilization and movement. Most of the early Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another. The present emblem, 24 cogs and six spokes, was adopted in 1924. A keyway was added to signify usefulness. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 International Convention.
