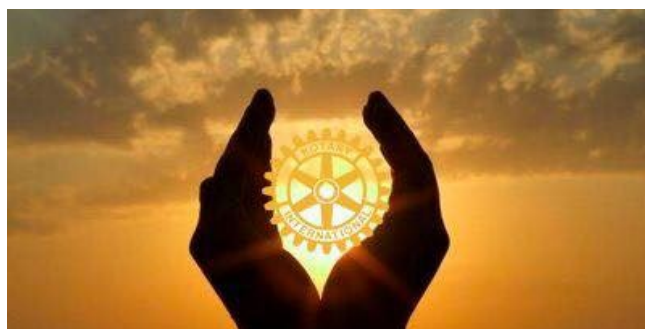

## June 2018 Board Meeting

### May Community Report 2018

Although I have not done a lot of actual community project work this month I have been busy liaising with Dianne Lagerwey who is the Community Development Officer at Mountain District Learning Centre. Dianne has been working for some time with Community Housing Victoria Limited (CHVL) who manage the low cost housing village in Burwood Highway on the corner of Dorset Road. CHVL have been attempting for some time now to provide shade sails over the playground area. In addition to this they also have a number of other projects that they are interested in developing. Community Housing Limited is a large organisation operating world wide to help the underprivileged. I believe with a collaboration between MDLC, CHVL and Rotary club of Fern Tree Gully we can have an ongoing working relationship with this facility.

### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

May2018

#### Nasavusavu Special Education School.

- Committee members of RC Savusavu are back from vacation and came back to us with a quote for purchasing laptops/notebooks for the students to use in class. The Principal and teachers are very enthusiastic. At this point it would seem that the left over funds currently held by RC Savusavu will cover the cost of the equipment but until we get the final wash-up we won't be sure. I have assured RC Savusavu that we still have \$2,500 in the budget to cover any extra costs in this project.

#### Sungai Kolok – Anti Trafficking and Medical Outreach program in Southern Thailand

- Our club gave a letter pledging support of \$1,500 to this project. Funds will be held until the Global Grant application is settled and if necessary, will be carried over to the 2018-19 Rotary year.
- **Operation Cleft** – Bruce McEwen addressed the club on this project and left with a cheque for \$1,000 in his pocket.

#### 2018-19 Budget:

##### Pramanit Foundation, New Dehli, India

- The incoming committee are considering a number of projects in which the club may be interested. At the moment however, we are favouring one of the Pramanit Foundation proposals. Lorraine Young is again visiting Australia and will address the club on 12<sup>th</sup> July.

#### Nasavusavu Special Education School.

- With the demise of ABC Dreams we are now dealing direct with RC Savusavu and will again take up sponsorship of our Special Education students at the school known locally as "Yaroi". Details will be given to the Board as soon as they are finalised.

#### Other Budget Items

- I anticipate there will be some unexpected requests for donations/sponsorship during the coming year and I will include an amount to cover this in the budget.
