Wednesday, 10th July, 2018

There was a talkback session with three Rotaractor's, one of whom was our own Rebecca Fry from the Rotaract Club of Sydney City. Other interesting speakers included Caryl Stern, President and CEO of UNICEF USA, Xavier Ramey, CEO Justice Informed USA, (who can trace his ancestry back to the days of American slaves,) and also Justin Trudeau, Prime Minister of Canada. The closing session mainly revolved around speeches by Barry Rassin and Ian Riseley followed by some more entertainment.

Back in Oz, last Saturday night saw us out at Tullamarine Airport to farewell our exchange student Maja who was heading back home after her year long visit to Australia. There were 5

or 6 exchange students all leaving on the same flight and after many goodbye's and a few tears they were off to board the plane.

Sunday of course saw us celebrating our Changeover. This gave me the perfect opportunity on behalf of all the members to thank Christine for the wonderful job she has done over the past two years. After she had handed me the President's Collar it was my pleasure to present Christine with a Paul Harris Fellow which was certainly well deserved.

COMMUNITY RADIO

Community Radio southern FM88.3 Allan and Christine attended the first meeting for twelve rotary clubs who are going to participate meeting held on Wed 27th June. The station has a Rotary Hour 3-4 pm every Tuesday, our club will be hosting an hour show once every twelve weeks, the programme is entirely up to us as to the content, e.g. pre-recorded interviews (our guest speakers) i.e. Kate from Spectrum Journeys Steve Flemming on his historical subjects, our choice of music, events our club is having etc.
