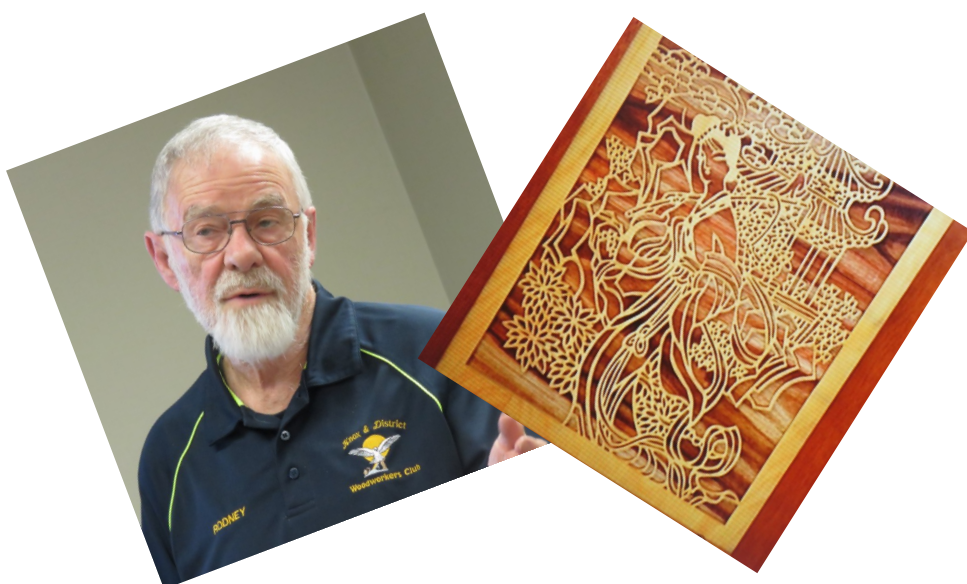

Knox Woodworkers began in 1988 in Ferntree Gully Tech school. Alf Stephens was the founder and they are now located in FTG next to the power station. They have started a "BE IN IT" comp. The open day for this comp. is on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> August, and all are welcome when it opens at 2.30pm. Fellowship and improving skills are an important part of the club. There are many different groups in the club. The Toy Group make the toys and make 300 to 500 toys a year. They sell the toys to the kids for \$5, sell at carnivals and fairs and festivals. They are also given to charities. They have a Wood Carving Group who make pictures in 3D, Furniture Makers, Wood Turners and a Rocking Horse Group. Other activities include projects such as repairing furniture. They made 14 Easels for the Boronia Art Group, possum boxes for Council, mobile walls etc.

They have 190 members both Men and women. Fees \$100 per year. They pay a peppercorn rent to Knox Council for their rooms. Finances come from what they sell, grants from Knox Council, Bendigo Bank, raffles and other grants.

**Mike thanked Rodney** and presented him with an RC FTG pen.

# VALE

## JOHN RICHARDS

31 July 1941—9th August 2018



I had known John for a very long time. We met when I was appointed Registrar at Burnley Horticultural College in early 1959. John was at the time this fresh faced member of the student leadership group. I transferred from Burnley to Longerenong and later Dookie Agricultural Colleges in early 1961 and did not see John for thirty-two years when a mutual friend asked me to speak to the Rotary Club of Fern Tree Gully about my then position in the Victorian Ombudsman's Office. When my friend introduced me to John we just laughed. In spite of the years we recognised each other instantly.

My role today is to speak of John's involvement in Rotary which was a very big part of his life. For those perhaps not familiar with Rotary I should explain that it is a worldwide service and social club. The clubs have committees for each of their areas of service (Vocational, Community, International, Youth and cCub Service). In addition, there are often minor committees for interests such as membership or social.

John's connection with Rotary started very early for in 1965 he was selected as a member of a Group Study Exchange Team to travel to Pennsylvania in the US. I should explain that the role of the teams is to expose the members to international examples of bodies that operate in their areas of business. In John's case perhaps a horticultural research institute, an orchard or plant farm.

In July 1973 John joined the Rotary Club of Fern Tree Gully. I am not sure if the club immediately recognised John's ability or whether it took advantage of the "new boy" because the following year John was appointed Secretary of the club. This is not the most sought after role in any group and I doubt that there was a queue lining up to take on the role. If the latter reason was why John became Secretary it did not take him long to wake up because after two years he moved to chair of the Community committee then in 1979 he took over the presidency of the club and in the following year became the District Governor's Representative.

In 1986 John was the second member of the club to be

awarded the prestigious Paul Harris Fellowship.

When speaking of John's involvement in Rotary it would be wrong of me not to also acknowledge Anne and their girls for between the years 1987 and 2000 the Richards family hosted eight youth exchange students. Believe me this is no small feat as they must make them part of their family must show them our country and look after their general wellbeing. Whilst most of these secondary school students are good such is not always the case as Anne can attest for I am aware that one student was a real trial.

In his years of membership John chaired each of the club's major committees and most of the minor ones.

If what I have described was all that John had done in Rotary I would describe his contribution as distinguished however I have only described his club activities but John also contributed to the Rotary District. (Our District covers a quite large area-from Wandin to Monbulk to Emerald ,towards the city as far as Mont Albert and south to the bay). From 1977 to 1980 John served on the District Youth Exchange Committee and chaired that committee in 1980.

From 1980 to 1985 John served on the Group Study Exchange Committee and together with Anne led a team to Sweden (there were five members in that team).

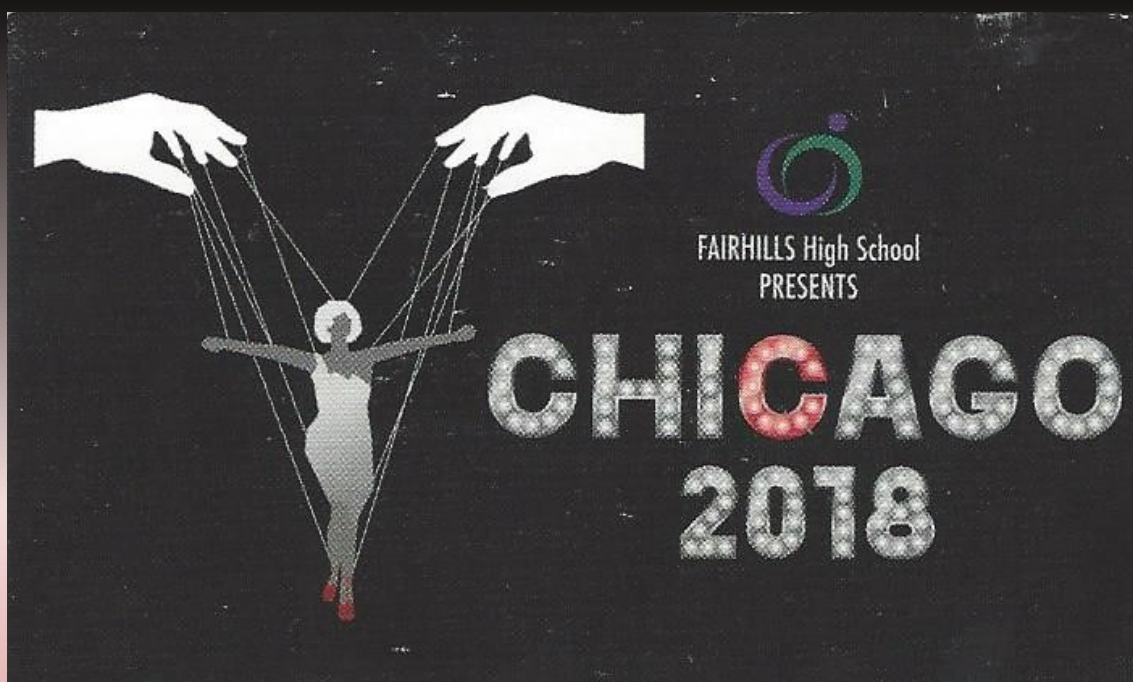
In 1984 John received the Rotary Foundation District Service Award.

You can see why when I became club president in 1998 John was one of three experienced members that I asked to help steer me through the year.

John's record speaks for itself and when he left Rotary in mid 2001 after twenty-eight and a half years service clearly his contribution could only have been described as magnificent and one which Anne, Carolynne and Susan must be very proud of particularly as they were so part of it.

John was the head of a Rotary family which as you would understand is held in the highest regard particularly in the Rotary Club of Fern Tree Gully. Few have contributed as much.
