At our meeting on Thursday Christine gave us another angle on the Polio Plus campaign in her report on Rotary Knowledge. I for one was not aware that the vaccination campaign started in the Philippines. To date this year we have had only 14 reported cases of Polio but the World Health Organisation is keeping a close eye on a number of areas world wide. Some of the areas under close scrutiny include Afghanistan, Nigeria, Papua New Guinea and Lake Chad Basin in Africa. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation have once again committed to back the efforts that are being undertaken and have pledged \$35 million a year.

24th October is World Polio Day and we are looking at ways to bring this more to the attention of the public.

Over the next month we have a number of events coming up starting with our visit this coming Thursday to the musical Chicago which is being put on by the students at Fairhills High School.

Also on Thursday we will be sizzling sausages again at Bunnings Scoresby. This will be followed on Friday 31st with a visit to Waterford Valley Lakes retirement village for afternoon tea.

Our article for the next edition of Ferntree Gully News is due to go to the publishers on 6th September so if anybody has an interesting article please let us know.

As part of our ongoing commitment to the local community a couple of our members will be attending the meeting to discuss what can be done to help the homelessness situation in the area. This will be attended by a number of local organisations.

On Tuesday September 11th we will have 8 members at the fundraising event at the Knox Club to raise funds for Australian Rotary Health. The speaker will be Iain Findlay, ex Vietnam Vet, decorated Police Officer and AFL player advocate at Tribunal Hearings. MC will be Simon Madden.

The 50th anniversary of the Fern Tree Gully Bowling Club is being celebrated on 15th September and a number of members from the Rotary Club will be attending. The Committee of the Rotary Club back in 1968 helped establish the formation of the Bowling Club and some of those members also served on the initial Bowling Club committee.

A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE

The recent demise of one of our earliest members (John Richards) had me trolling through Stuart Vize's "A Potted History of the Rotary Club of Fern Tree Gully" and I thought some of our present day members would enjoy a few of the snippets. You'll notice that we have explored the setting up of an Interact before!

The first milestone was reached on May 16th, when our Charter was granted by R.I., and subsequently presented to our Club by Dist. Gov. Ken Davies at Dandenong Town Hall on June 6th, before a wonderful gathering of 300 Rotarians and guests.

1963-64

- Initially, the dinner charge was 10/6 a head, 8/6 to the caterer & 2/- to Club funds.
- A sub committee was appointed to design a Club banner.
- Put in island lawns at F.T.G. shopping centre parking area.
- Organized BBQ for sixty boys from the Salvation Army Special School at The Basin.
- "Freedom From Hunger" campaign, £162 [pounds] collected.
- Conducted a Safety Week project involving the Police Safety Squad; short notice resulted in one week 2,250 students from 11 schools successfully moved to centres in Upper Fern Tree Gully, Boronia and Upwey.

1964-5

- Participated in the **Student Exchange Program** with *Dianne Martin* going to District 717, New York, USA; *Janet Gale* came from America and attended Upwey High.
- Six dozen pants & shirts provided for the T.B. Hospital, Beta Paka, New Guinea.
- Assistance given to Scouts' International Jamboree, Carols By Candlelight, Winston Churchill and Red Cross Door Knockers.
- Education Week - the Club was addressed by Mr. R. E. Thompson, Headmaster of Melbourne High.
- Ian Hibbins' wife, Francis, suggested a circle of fern leaves, after a design on a Berli box containing "Light-as-a-Feather" underwear; while Lyonel Tozer suggested our Latitude & Longitude should be included.
- Mrs. Roderiguez, of the Art Society, was asked to design a banner using a circle of fern leaves, the southern cross, lines showing latitude and longitude and a Rotary wheel.

1965-66

- Firewood, 8 tons, for needy pensioners, cut, bagged and delivered
- Initiated the Bowling Club of Fern Tree Gully's formation.
- Supported the formation of an Apex Club in the Fern Tree Gully area, as suggested by the Bayswater Apex Club.
- Best Garden Award (under 2 years old), perpetual Shield donated; Initiated there is a need for the establishment of "A Day Centre for Retarded Children" for the areas of the Shires of Knox and Sherbrooke; Mrs Rule and Mrs Deprader assisted.
- Meeting Venue:** Regular meetings were moved from *La Danza* to the Hotel Stamford in December. Meal cost 15/-, Dinner Fee now 16/-.

1966-67

- "Day Centre Project" progressing; Keith Cathcart from Mental Hygiene involved; combined meeting with R.C. of Belgrave held 15th May, 67 - moved a Public Meeting be called; Car Raffle proposed.

- "Bowls". Tender for Greens Construction advertised; commenced 8th May: Working Bee 13th and 14th May; A.G.M. 23rd May; Club House plans completed.
- Hosted G.S.E. Team from Pennsylvania, USA, on 2nd October, '66.
- Careers' Night** held 2nd November

1967-68

- To assist funds for the "Fern Tree Gully Bowling Club's Club House" - a Supper Dance held 26th August.
- \$700 donated at the Public Meeting called in respect of the "Intellectually Handicapped Centre"; well attended and 21 nominated to the Committee of Management.
- Ivan Southall ("I Can Jump Puddles.") guest of Club when Dr. Dax was guest speaker at a regular meeting.
- "Knoxbrooke" chosen as name for the Intellectually Handicapped Centre.
- Negotiations begun to acquire suitable land for Knoxbrooke.
- Business Men's Dinner held Thursday, 29th February, 1968 to launch the Knoxbrooke Appeal Month.
- Combined **Vocational Guidance Night** held 8th November.
- In conjunction with R.C. of Belgrave Conducted District Conference, at Marybrooke for District 282.

1968-69

- Interact Club investigated.
- Sports Parade for Knoxbrooke with 30 boys from the Salvation Army Boys Home in attendance.
- Assisted in the Barry Hanlon Appeal (Scoresby fireman killed on duty).
- Conducted the Kathy Lee Appeal* - a 6 year old F.T.G. girl in need of heart surgery to remedy a congenital heart disease. \$1,900 for air fares for Kathy and one parent was required for her to have the operation in London, \$2,220:00 raised; picture on front page of The Sun. Kathy left on 8th May & was successfully operated upon on 20th May.
- Rotary Foundation, establishment of a Small Change "barrel" on the tables each meeting, with \$38 raised in the 6 months.
- Group Study Exchange: To District 686 Alabama, USA; two nominees, Rob Barfus and Neil Harrison - Neil became a team member, to visit Alabama in August, 1969. (Both later became Rotarians).
- Showed Dist.686 Team our Education with visits to Primary and Secondary Schools, Burwood Teachers' College, Mount Scopus College and Monash University.
- Organized a Careers Night at the Community Hall, U.F.T.G. Thirty Counsellors interviewed 450 in three hours.
- Classifications:** During the year, the new "residential clause" came into effect.

1969-'70

- Meetings moved from the Stamford Hotel to Waiora Receptions as from 5th March, 1970.
