During 2009/2010 the club had the privilege of supporting our friend Lizzie whilst she awaited the birth of her baby, and following the birth, with visits and material assistance for her and her son.

Thanks a million to Cass Bench and Debbie Lyon for being the main providers of that support.

Also, thank you to my daughter, Eve John, who also helped to support Lizzie during and after the pregnancy.

We continued during the year to assist the Foothills Community Church with their Wednesday evening Community kitchen meals, by helping out during the evening; serving, cleaning up, washing up, chatting to the guests, etc.

Our help is very much appreciated by Steve Barrington of Foothills church.

Unfortunately the number of Club members who can assist has dwindled somewhat. Whereas we were always able to provide 2 helpers on a regular fortnightly basis, most times now it is only one. Community Service is planning on holding regular "car boot sales" at the Salvation Army venue in Fern Tree Gully. Thanks to President Merv for allowing us to use it.

The first one is planned for Saturday, 31 July, 2010. We are hoping to have face painting, a sausage sizzle and other entertainment there, to attract families.

International Service Report . 2009 – 2010

During the past year, International service has been active in the following areas:

- **Wheel Chairs for Kids**
Stuart Vize has again been a significant contributor to this program at district level, and it has been our pleasure to support Stuart & this most worthy program with a donation of \$1,000:00. Most of which was collected through our 'wishing well' at Knox Tavern who we again thank for their support.
- **Shelter boxes**
With several major events worldwide including earthquakes in Haiti and the Soloman Islands, the club made a donation of \$7000 for shelter boxes.
- **Benevolent Account**
Again this year, we thank our benefactor, the late Ivan Gigovic, whose generosity has provided the club with the ability to continue our International Service work.

We have also been involved in the following areas:-

- **Interplast**, a true & tried Rotary project, sending a Medical Team to repair disabling features in people from an area in the developing countries of the Pacific.
- **ROMAC**, another tried & successful Rotary project; bringing and caring for Disabled Children and their parent/chaperone from overseas for medical assistance not possible at home.
- **Rotary Group Study Team** from Turkey, D.2420. We, [Merv Lincoln; John Flemming; Enid Hughes & Stuart Vize] had the pleasure of providing the program for the Team's first Friday [5:2:'10] of their four weeks in Australia. The team enjoyed their day, visiting Knox Police Complex, 'Ecotech' [a local business testing 'air' for people all around the world] & lunched with the C.E.O. & a number of Directors of the City of Knox over which time they learned of Local Government as compared with what exists at home. It being the end of their first week the Team were happy to have some time for personal shopping at Knox City before we all met for coffee, after which they were driven to a scheduled meeting.
- **Dolls**. The Club received, as a donation, many small knitted dolls, which proved to be of great value to the Wheelchairs for Children project – as a soft toy & a small rug are sent with each chair.
- **Used Stamps**. Thank you to all who contribute !
The Club continues to collect "Used Stamps" for the District's project "**Sight for Sore Eyes**"

* After an absence of sponsoring an incoming Youth Exchange student in 2009/10 it’s very exciting to have one for this coming year.

* Our new **incoming student** for 2010/11 is Magnus Henriksen from Denmark. He is the 3rd child of four children and his older sister was a Rotary exchange student to Australia some years ago.

Magnus is from a small town, **Sonderborg, Denmark** and his parents are practitioners. He is looking forward to experiencing life in Australia and sounds like someone that will adapt well.

* **Magnus will arrive on 23rd July** & his first host parents will be Mark and Julie Goodchild.

* **JOHN COLLINS** was our outbound Student who went to France in **2008**. John started his experience with Rotary in **2006** when he went to **his first RYPEN camp** as a participant, and then **went back in 2007 as a Team Leader**.
