UPDATE ON OUR STUDENTS AT MOUNTAIN DISTRICT LEARNING CENTRE:

For those of you who are not aware, Rotary FTG have, for the last few years, been successful in obtaining a District 9810 low level scholarship grant which has enabled us to sponsor two students at MDLC. Below is a summary of what this year's two students have achieved. (*Names have been changed to protect privacy*)

1. Michael

Michael used his scholarship to cover his Resources and Amenities fees at MDLC plus he purchased a laptop and accessories to assist him to complete his school work. Due to circumstances at home, he moved to Doncaster closer to the end of the year and was finding the commute a little hard so he did not successfully complete his Senior VCAL this year. He was able to secure a part time job at a car detailer and he has decided to pursue further hours with this next year.

2. Beth

Beth used her scholarship to cover her Tuition, Resources and Amenities fees as she was exited from her local school and was responsible for paying these fees herself. Her family's circumstances did not allow her to be able to cover this payment so the scholarship assisted them greatly. She was also able to purchase some computer accessories to assist with completing some of the work outside of class. Unfortunately she did have some medical issues this year which did not allow her to successfully complete her VCAL Foundation. She also managed to secure part time employment near the end of the year which she is wanting to continue as well as continuing her education however the hours of work do not allow her to do this at MDLC.
