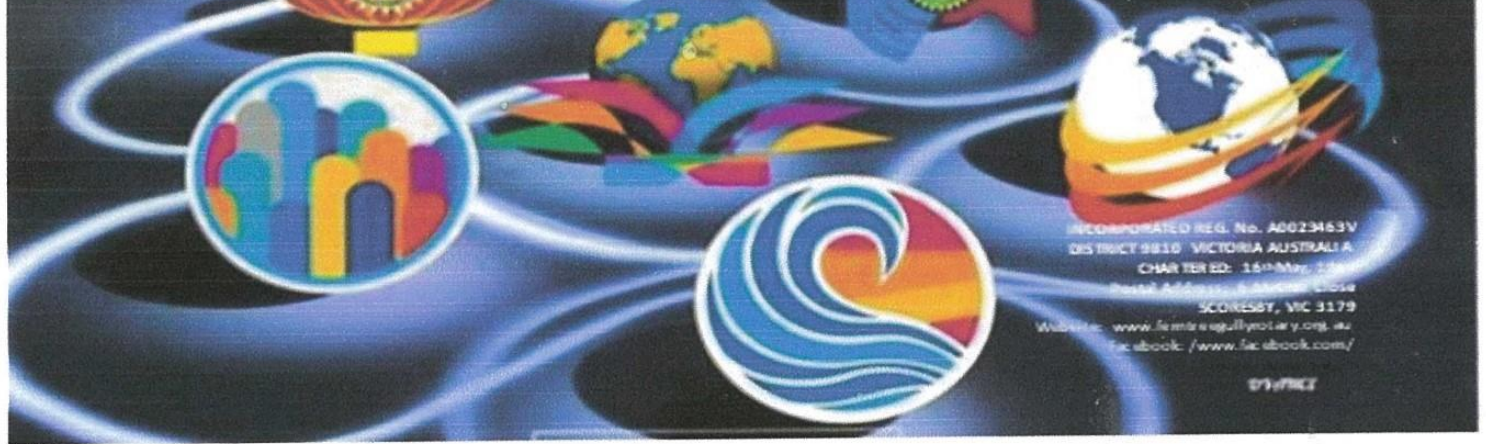

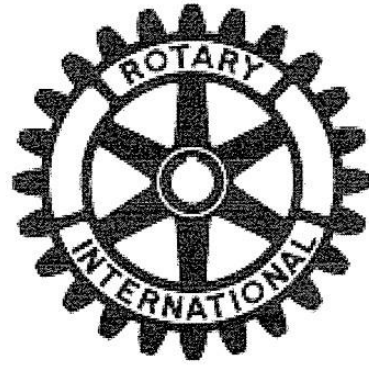

2018-2019

Our Rotary Year started under the Presidential guidance of Ray Hollis, with much enthusiasm as we embraced the Rotary Theme **BE THE INSPIRATION**.

In the month of July 2018 we welcomed our Youth Exchange Student Guilia Baisini from Italy. The exchange being shared with the Rotary Club of Bayswater, members from both clubs have had the pleasure of enjoying special times with this lovely bright young lady.

Early in August with only three days' notice Bunnings asked if we could fill in on the coming Sunday. This could not have come at a better time, as that was the week Channel Nine and Rotary Australia launched their partnership with the National Farmers Federation for emergency relief for the drought ridden farmers throughout Australia. We raised \$2225.00 on the one day all of which went to BUY A BALE.

We have again been able to continue our scholarship scheme with the help of a District Grant, giving two students from Mountain District Learning Centre the opportunity to complete their high school studies.

Club members attended the FTG Bowling Clubs 50th Anniversary, a special milestone also for our club as we (Ken Miller) helped establish the Bowling Club, AND WE NOW CALL IT HOME

We were privileged to celebrate the Annual presentations for FTG CFA and present a donation from our Club, we also gave them support cooking at their Community Fire Awareness evening for local residents

When I reflect over the last twelve months, all the activities members have been involved in it is truly remarkable. I would like to capture some of them.

First and foremost it might sound like hard work and yes some of it was but most of all it was all fun and gave us the opportunity to unite all club members and their partners.

I am proud to say that all the District Seminars District Assembly and Multi District Conference held in Melb we have had representation at them all Thank you to you all,

Our **Youth** programmes chaired by Paul Wilson are going from strength to strength.

Our Interact Club at Fairhills is flourishing, even though the number of students is slightly fewer than previous years, they too have had a successful year. A couple of their own activities have been a fundraising evening in the form of Qizzame Electronic version of Trivia, and they have been cleaning up the local Dandenong Creek, not only removing bags of litter, but also retrieving a shopping trolley.

Two Interactors participated in the Model United Nation Assembly over two days in Parliament House. They were given Jordan as the country they had to represent, great costumes and interesting debating throughout the weekend.

We sent four students to the week camp Rotary Youth Programme of Enrichment.

Our Rotary Junior Community Award Programme is for students in grade 6, it is a twelve month programme, similar to The Duke of Edinburgh award 20 Students from both Fairhills and FTG North Primary completed the program

Our approach to our local **community** projects was changed slightly this year, we wanted to Show Case what Rotary is all about, speak to local resident's and find out where we can assist in in FTG.

We are working in partnership with support groups locally which will be ongoing

The Dandenong Ranges Winter Sleep Over, a program for homeless men sleeping rough.

FTG Community Support Program to advise people who need assistance with local services, meals etc. We gave a donation to the Foothills Community Church Christmas Lunch along with Christmas presents for MEN.

We ran a very successful free Halloween party for the residents in the Low Cast Housing Complex in FTG. I don't know who had the most fun us or the children all dressed up in our Halloween costumes, we also donated all the shade trees for the children's playground at the complex prior to this event.

FAIRHILLS HIGH

We are continuing our exciting relationship with Fairhills High School, focusing, (where appropriate), our Rotary Youth Programs upon them per below:

INTERACT

A school interact club of 14 to 18 year olds is sponsored by a Rotary club to work with the school to form, develop and support the club which involves itself in local community, develops skills, and make a difference locally and globally.

This year numbers have dropped to around six to eight, predominantly new students around an ongoing (growing) core. They have identified a number of potential programs for the year and have, to date conducted an environmental clean -up day down at the local creek. We are about to present pins to this year's participants.

RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment).

Is a residential experience, where participants are involved in a variety of sessions, workshops and activities, which provide an opportunity for them to personally develop, challenge themselves, build friendships with like-minded people, and build life skills and / or awareness in areas such as leadership, working in a team, communication, goal setting, public speaking, contributing to the community, growing up in a digital world; and safe driving.

This year we have identified potential candidates and plan to send three or four candidates from Fairhills High, to the RYPEN camp in anticipation of them becoming future office bearers Interact.

MUNA (Model United Nations Assembly).

Is a two day program which simulates sessions of the General Assembly of the United Nations. A team of two students is allocated a country to represent. They adopt that country's dress and represent their country in the Legislative Assembly Chamber of Parliament House.

This year (our second), we sponsored two students from Fairhills High. Thanks to the Rotary members who made their way in to support them over the two days. They had a visibly great time just grinning when asked how it was!

RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award)

Is an intensive six-day training program held at YMCA Lake Dewar Lodge, Myrniong, for young people aged 18 to 30. The program covers fundamentals and ethics of positive leadership, communication skills, problem-solving and conflict management, Rotary's purpose and service to the community, building self-confidence and self-esteem and elements of community and global citizenship.

This year the club failed to identify a suitable candidate for RYLA.

RJCA (Rotary Junior Community Award)

Is an exciting and innovative program initiated by the Rotary Club of Mitchell River which aims to assist children in the final year of primary school gain a more informed and balanced view of our community. It offers children the opportunity to develop personal skills that can be used both for themselves or shared more widely with community members or organizations. It introduces young people to a very necessary aspect of our communities – the work of the volunteer and can be thought of as a mini Duke of Edinburgh Award.

This year we have 20 students from Ferntree Gully North Primary and 6 Fairhills Primary School participating in the program under our sponsorship.

Bowel Scan Report : John Flemming

The club again participated in the Rotary bowel scan programme as it has done for many years

. We partnered with four pharmacies (Upper Ferntree Gull, Mountain Gate, Stud Park and Scoresby Village). Sales this year dropped dramatically in that we only sold thirty kits where in the past years two of our pharmacies would have sold that many. The explanation for this that the Commonwealth Government has increased publication of it's scheme covering 50 to 74 year olds and doctors have become more involved in selling kits. From next year it is anticipated that Rotary sales will be conducted on line so if such is the case the club will distribute pamphlets through pharmacies advising of the steps required to obtain kits.

This Scheme has been well supported by our club for many years simply if we have been responsible for saving one life the effort has been worthwhile.
