THE WEEKS THAT WERE

Thursday 25th March 2021

The meeting was opened at 6-30pm by President Graeme.

Announcements:

He welcomed the speaker, Russell Marnock, a member of Doncaster Rotary Club.

He noted that member support will be needed at the special Bunnings Scoresby sizzle on ANZAC Day that we have been offered since another Club pulled out.

Also, on ANZAC Day, we will be placing a wreath, made by Christine, at the Arboretum at 10am.

Speaker - Russell Marnock, on THE END TRACHOMA story

(Side note – Our Club sponsored Russell's daughter as a Youth Exchange student to Germany many years ago)

The Rotary Club of Melbourne started the whole project, and it grew to be international – Our RI president endorsed it during his presidency, as an Australian-born project. The Melbourne Eye and Ear Hospital has been involved since the early days of the project.

Trachoma is a bacterial infection, and young kids are most susceptible to it.

World Health organization (WHO) aimed for an end to trachoma by end 2020, with their **SAFE** program. **Surgery**

Antibiotics

Face cleaning, and

Environmental.

These cover most of the Rotary International focus areas, so it made sense to look at Rotary supporting them.

Regrettably, Australia is the only developed country which still has a trachoma problem, mainly in the remote Indigenous communities.

A conference was held in Alice Springs in 2019, with 120 attendees from all over the country – a great effort, given the distances that needed to be travelled.

The project now aligns its efforts with those of the WA and NT Departments of Health, getting them to distribute their Eye Health kits to the (mainly) aboriginal communities, and assisting them with the educational efforts where possible and where needed.

There was even a national "Mirror" project, where non-glass mirrors were supplied by Bunnings and installed AT KID HEIGHT in local facilities.

Russell noted that they have found that the traditional Aboriginal concepts of "all is for the use of all" can hinder the introduction of some of our western approaches (where singular-person-only usage is required)— they are adapting their implementation procedures and practices as required to get around the conflicts that inevitably occur.

He used a video which looked very interesting – *but we could not hear it* – we'll get there in the end!
