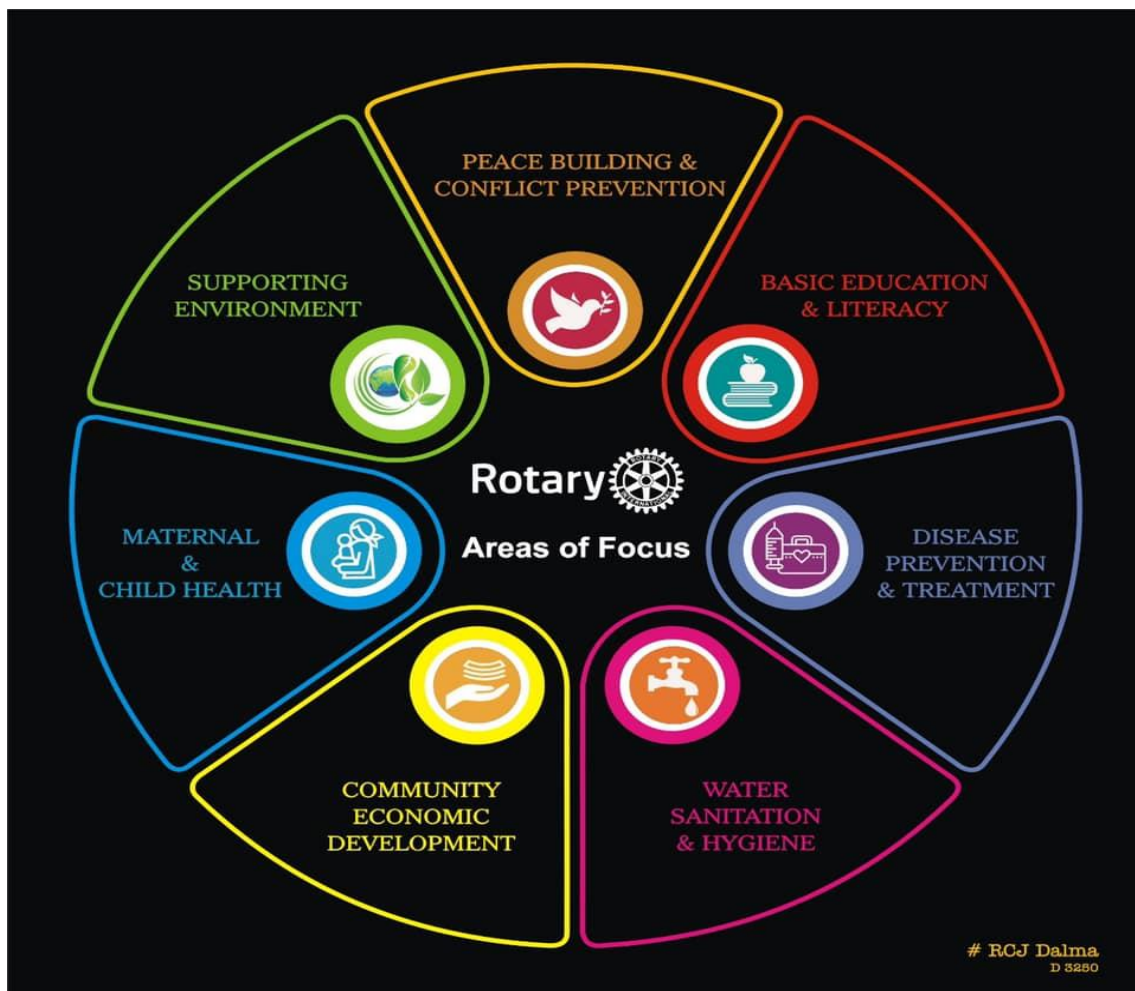
Other Business
