Announcements:

She welcomed partner Marg H. as well as the speaker, Ian Armstrong of EERN.

<u>Rotary Toast:</u> this was re-introduced to our meetings (with a shortened version by Brian M this time).

<u>Men's Lunch:</u> Fran has discovered an organisation called Men's Lunch and read out a profile of this club for men who would like to meet and chat. Graeme A has seen it before and will investigate further and report back to the Club.

<u>Speaker</u> – PP Ian Armstrong, on <u>EERN (Eastern Emergency Relief Network)</u>

lan is a member of Nunawading Rotary and the President of EERN, which supplies emergency relief to people in need in six municipalities in the eastern suburbs including Knox. All goods are donated by councils, commercial firms, or households and are accepted by the EERN trucks only if they are in good safe working order. EERN even has their own Test and Tag facility, with qualified staff able to assess the electrical equipment being donated.

Beneficiaries are referred and initially accompanied to EERN by their aid agencies/support organisations, who directly assist the poor/ homeless/ old/ financially or emotionally distressed clients and assess their particular needs. All goods are donated free of charge to the needy and are collected by the recipients from the two warehouses in Mitcham that are owned by EERN.

EERN supports its work by membership fees from the over 140 member aid agencies/support organisations, local councils, commercial firms and, of course, grants and donations from anyone anywhere. It is totally staffed by **VOLUNTEERS**, some of which have been doing the good work for over 20 years – ERRN was started in 1995 as an independent organisation, and was the forerunner of what has become WERN in the western suburbs and RIMEN in the inner suburbs of Melbourne, these

last 2 being fully-Rotary organisations. South-east Melbourne areas are also in need of EERN-type aid activities, lan says.

Donors of furniture and other housewares can contact them at warehouse@easternemergency.org.au, and they will also appreciate donations, either of money or time (whatever hours you can spare). They currently need help to replace an old 2005 heavily-used truck (around \$80,000 needed - perhaps US in part?).

Reports

Treasurer: Brian M asked about the status of the old "Swindle", as it was part of the \$5 weekly Administration contribution. This levy was recently re-introduced, with payments now being accepted at the meeting by Graeme A - with our new EFTPOS machine.
