President Fran welcomed our speaker Alma Reynolds and our newest member Martin Howard.

President Fran then proposed a toast to Rotary International and Australia. Christine Anderson then spoke about how the club has changed its direction after two meetings on the subject, it was decided that the club did not enough time to facilitate the meeting on the 27^{th of} October 2022.

Alma Reynolds then spoke about membership, and she brought up the following worthwhile points.

- 1. You need a list of 80 to 100 people as you are looking at a strike rate of 1 to 12.
- 2. When you invite people to a meeting, make sure you have at least three, and all similar age. Ensure you have a balance of males and. females.
- 3. When you write an invitation letter make sure you have at least two people frame the letter.
- 4. Make sure new members are involved in club activities.
- 5. When you invite someone along don't necessarily put a membership form in front of them but invite them to participate in a club project. Also, when you invite someone along makes sure you invite their partners as well.

Paul Wilson then gave a vote of thanks to Alma for attending our meeting and giving us help with our membership drive.

President Fran advised the meeting that 89% voted yes for the regionalisation vote. She is still strongly interested in the bin project and has asked members to continue checking local venues to see if they are providing bins in the men's toilets.
